Minor Prophets

The Minor Prophets (called that because of the general shorter length in comparison to the major prophets, not because of the importance of the prophet or message) often address the sins of God people and how they have grown comfortable in their sins. Often, the people of God had become fulfilled in their wealth and failed to allow the law of God to go forth from them as they lived it in their everyday lives. They trusted in their wealth as a sign that God was with them, when His Word continually condemned their selfishness and failure to care for others. In a time when the rich get richer and the poor get poorer, God’s message is the same for us today. We constantly want more and believe we will be satisfied with more wealth (or sheepishly that we deserve more), yet what we really need is the promise of God’s Word. A Savior will come (Micah 5:2-4) and we will all go to Him and worship Him. He will teach us to do in His Word, through the words of His prophets! Micah (6:8) tells us still today, “*He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?*” May we not forget His Word and use our wealth to bless and serve others so that justice, kindness, and humility flow through us in faith in order to bless others in this world.
