## PASTOR MATT'S MUSINGS

Dale Carnegie included the story "Father Forgets" by W. Livingston Larned in his book, "How to Win Friends and Influence People" as an encouragement to all of us who can so easily forget ourselves and spend days critiquing and criticizing others. We can look at this story, not just of a father who realizes his mistakes, but of the young boy who with an unconditional spirit of affirmation wields a level of influence that changes his father forever.

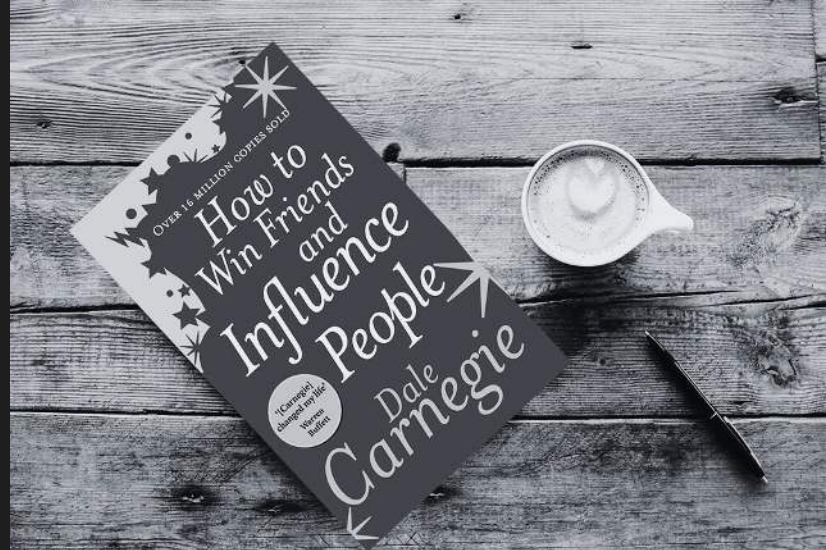
"Listen Son, I am saying this as you lie asleep, one little hand crumpled under your cheek and blonde curls sticky over your wet forehead. I have broken into your room alone. Just a few minutes ago, as I sat reading my paper in the library, a stifling wave of remorse swept over me. Guilty, I came to your bedside.

There are things which I am thinking, son: I had been cross to you. I scolded you as you were dressing for school because you gave your face a mere dab with the towel. I took you to task for not cleaning your shoes. I called out angrily when you threw some of your things on the floor.

At breakfast, I found fault, too. You spilled things. You gulped down your food. You put your elbows on the table. You spread butter too thick on your bread. As you started off to play and I made for my train, you turned and waved a hand and called, "Goodbye, Daddy!" I frowned and said in reply, "Hold your shoulders back!"

Then it began all over again late this afternoon. As I came up the road, I spied you down on your knees, playing marbles. There were holes in your socks. I humiliated you before your friends by marching you ahead of me to the house. Socks were expensive, and if you had to buy them you would be more careful! Imagine that son, from a father.

Do you remember later, when I was reading in the library, how you came timidly, with



sort of a hurt look in your eyes? I glanced up over my paper, impatient at the interruption; you hesitated at the door. "What is it that you want?" I snapped.

You said nothing, but ran across in one tempestuous plunge, threw your arms around my neck and kissed me, your small arms tightened with affection that God had set blooming in your heart, which even neglect could not wither. Then you were gone, pattering up the stairs.

Well, Son, it was shortly afterwards that my paper slipped from my hands and a terrible sickening fear came over me. What has habit been doing to me? The habit of finding fault, or reprimanding; this was my reward to you for being a boy. It was not that I did not love you: it was that I expected too much of you. I was measuring you by the yardstick of my own years.

There is so much that was good, fine and true in your character. The little heart of yours was as big as the dawn itself over the hills. This was shown by your spontaneous impulse to rush in and kiss me good night. Nothing else mattered tonight. Son, I have come to your bedside in the darkness, I have knelt there, ashamed!

It is a feeble atonement; I know that you would not understand these things which I have told you in the waking hours. Tomorrow I will be a real daddy! I will chum with you, suffer when you suffer and laugh when you

laugh. I will bite my tongue when impatient words come. I will keep saying as if it were a ritual: "He is nothing but a boy—a little boy."

I am afraid I have visualized you as a man. Yet as I see you now, Son, crumpled and weary in your bed. I see that you are still a baby. Yesterday you were in your mother's arms, your head on her shoulder. I have asked too much, too much!"

In response to this story, Dale Carnegie has also written this in his book: "Instead of condemning people, let's try to understand them. Let's try to figure out why they do what they do. That's a lot more profitable and intriguing than criticism; and it breeds sympathy, tolerance and kindness. To know all is to forgive all".

Dear friends, we have a Father in heaven Who is perfect, and His love for you is perfect! Because of our sinful condition, God provided for you and me in the most excellent way! For it's in His love that God gave us His only Son who changes our lives

forever through His death on the cross & resurrection from the grave! It's in this victory over sin, Satan, and the grave that we receive His forgiveness and that we are made His children! 1 John 3:1: "See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are."

And how do we respond to God's love for us? By loving others, showing them respect, and working to understand where they're coming from. Praise the Lord for our wonderful Heavenly Father and how He has provided for us in Jesus!

Happy Easter! Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!

# FINANCIAL UPDATE

We are humbled to announce that thanks to your incredible generosity and commitment to our shared mission, we have not only met but exceeded the matching funds challenge presented to Trinity in January. Your dedication and support have made an extraordinary impact, totaling over \$132,000. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to each and every one of you for this remarkable achievement.

We are also humbled to announce a generous estate gift of \$105,000 from a relative of one of our congregation members. This remarkable donation further bolsters our endowment and education funds. Whether it's enhancing our programs or investing in our church's future, this gift will have a profound impact.

With these blessings we have paid back the loan from the endowment fund, come current on any outstanding bills, fulfilled our commitments to synod and district, and are current on employer matching contributions. As we give thanks for achieving this milestone, we also want to encourage you to continue your stewardship by offering regular support to the church. Your ongoing generosity ensures that we can sustain our ministries, maintain our facilities, and expand our outreach efforts to touch even more lives with compassion and grace.

Looking ahead, we are excited to share that with the current trend of support, we are projected to repay our current internal line of credit of \$165,000 by the end of this fiscal year. This is a significant step towards financial stability and sustainability for our church. However, we recognize that there are still challenges ahead. To address these challenges and to secure our financial future, we have set a new goal: to double our internal line of credit. This will provide us with the necessary resources to bridge any gaps between our school Choice Scholarship

payments to continue our ministry without interruption.

Along with our long-term financial planning, progress is continuing on the Thielke Church Worker Scholarship. The trustees will convene in April to establish an account and allocate \$10,000 from the Endowment Fund for Christian Education to initiate this scholarship. This scholarship embodies our, and the Thielke's commitment to supporting individuals dedicated to serving within the church community. More details about the application process and eligibility criteria will be provided soon. We encourage eligible individuals to apply, and we look forward to assisting them in their educational journey.

It has been a challenging yet blessing filled start to the year. We invite you to join us in this journey towards financial strength and stability. Your continued prayers, support, and contributions are invaluable as we strive to fulfill our mission and live out our calling as followers of Christ.

Once again, we extend a heartfelt thank you for your extraordinary generosity and unwavering commitment to our Trinity community and we pledge to steward these gifts responsibly.

# ANNOUNCING: THE THOELKE CHURCH WORKER SCHOLARSHIP

Are you a member of Trinity or a graduate of Trinity School and a member of a sister LCMS congregation? And are you enrolled in a Concordia University or Seminary preparing for service as a professional church worker? If you can answer “yes” to both questions, you are invited to apply for the first annual awards of the Thaelke Church Worker Scholarship!

Applications are available from the Ministry Office or via email ([info@trinitycp.org](mailto:info@trinitycp.org)) and may be submitted upon successful completion of each academic year. The deadline for applications is July 15. An award of \$2000 will be made to each qualified applicant.

Please consider making a special donation for this fund! Or consider including it in your estate planning. Seed money for the fund has been set aside by the Trinity Endowment Fund to get things started. In addition, up to \$12,000 of matching funds have been provided by the Thaelke's with a further \$10,000 of matching funds being set aside by the Endowment Committee from the Education Endowment ministry funds.

This fund will help to encourage more pastors and teachers, DCE's and deaconesses to serve our Lord full time in His church. The harvest is plentiful but the laborers are few; pray the Lord of the harvest to raise up workers for His harvest field!

## EASTER GOSPEL IN SEVEN WORDS

Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed and gives us hope! That hope is future-oriented but impacts our lives now. Are you ready to tell of that hope? Throughout the Lenten season we considered how we might summarize the Gospel message of Christ, crucified and risen for sinners, and to do so in as few as seven words. Thank you to the many of you who responded with your own seven-word summary! Thank you to our Trinity School teachers who led their classes through this challenge in ways that fit their grade levels!

Now as we are celebrating our Savior's resurrection, I pray that you would continue to think in terms of how you would answer if asked for the reason for the hope that you have (1 Peter 3:15), and to do so briefly if necessary. These seven-word phrases won't be a full answer, but hopefully they could be the beginning of a longer conversation. Here are a few examples:

- Crucified for me, now I am free.
- Jesus Christ alone offers freedom from sin.
- Jesus died for our sins. Repent. Believe.
- Jesus' sinless death gives us life eternal.
- Jesus died so that we can live.
- Jesus forgives your sins and keeps promises.
- God is my salvation because He died.
- Love washes over me, my fears dissipate.
- Reconciled with the Father through the Son.
- God shines through sinners—yes, even sinners!

God bless you to know that hope that is yours in Christ, and to be ready to tell it in His name!
